






Drama Trip

Girls In Tech

It has been another exciting and busy time for Year 9 pupils who are completing the "Girls In Tech" programme. This term the girls have continued to learn about the amazing opportunities that are available to them in STEM subjects. The term kicked off with a visit to the TalkTalk headquarters where the girls had the opportunity to work with The & Partnership, an award-winning digital marking agency. The girls developed their understanding of how advertising works and received talks from experts in marketing campaigns. Collaborating with The & Partnership, the girls then continued to develop their App ideas and started to design their final Apps as part of the Girls In Tech App Competition. The & Partnership were impressed by the girls' creativity and teamwork.

The girls have also been involved in an **Interactive Day** at the school where they were mentored by leading female employees at TalkTalk to build their skills on pitching and presenting, confidence in leading a pitch and soft skills such as building resumes and interpersonal skills. The girls were a credit to the school and the mentors were fantastic in building their confidence and encouraging the girls to aim for careers in the tech industry. The girls have also had the rare and exciting opportunity to take part in a career talk and Q&A session with British Media Executive Rebekah Brookes. The girls were eager to know more about a career in the media and technology sector that involves journalism and writing.

Next term we look forward to some more interactive sessions where the girls will continue to work with mentors from TalkTalk and have to present their App ideas to Sir Charles Dunstone. As the **Girls In Tech** Co-Leaders, we are continually impressed by the girls' dedication to the programme and to themselves.

Trustees Update - The Dunstone Values - We Care, We Challenge, We Commit

In 2021, the trustees and governors met at Talk Talk in Manchester, the telecommunications company, where Sir Charles Dunstone, our Sponsor is the Chairman. The purpose of our meeting was to reset the identity and vision for the Dunstone Education Trust. We wanted a common set of values and behaviours which could be embedded across the Trust.

As part of our discussions, we looked at Talk Talk's company values: We Care, We Challenge, We Commit.

We were aware that Talk Talk's values had a strong business focus, for example, their definition for We Care is: 'We care about each other, our customers, and our community. That's why we're laser focused on our mission to bring simple, affordable, reliable and fair connectivity to everyone.'

However, during our meeting, trustees and governors were increasingly convinced that the values were completely accurate for the Trust and what we wanted to achieve.

Trustees and Governors agreed to adopt Talk Talk's values and set out how they applied for the Trust and each governing body.
